The tenth of this truck outward is 150<sup>t</sup> of tobacco: w<sup>ch</sup> said summe of 150<sup>t</sup> of tobacco the said James Neale in behalf of his said m<sup>r</sup> doth hereby acknowledge himselfe to owe vnto the Lord Proprietary to be paid on the 10<sup>th</sup> of Novemb next, in case it shalbe putt off for beaver; & he doth further hereby covenant to pay to the vse of the Lord

Proprietary at the next returne of the said vessell from her now intended voyage, the tenth part in kind of all beaver furrs w<sup>ch</sup> shalbe bought w<sup>th</sup> the said truck or any part thereof
