

Resolved and Ordered that the said Sir Thomas Lawrence Liber K.  
be wholly dismissed from his Place at the Councill Board & the Provincial Court & be Committed to the Sheriff of S<sup>t</sup> Marys County from thence to be Conveyed and committed close Prisoner into the Custody of Coll Warren high Sheriff of Charles County, without Bayle or Mainprise

M<sup>r</sup> Robert Mason high Sheriff of S<sup>t</sup> Marys County being called in to testify in behalf of their Majestys against M<sup>r</sup> Charles Caroll for several reflecting speeches and discourses against the Governm<sup>t</sup> upon his Oath declareth as follows (viz<sup>t</sup>)

That one Day at the House of the said Robert M<sup>r</sup> Cha Carroll and said Robert had some discourse of his Excellency the Gov<sup>r</sup> and Sir Thomas Lawrence, and said Carroll made reply to the said Robert that it was Pity there was any or so much difference between his Excellency & S<sup>r</sup> Thomas for he did beleive it would not be decided till such time as his Excellency was no Gov<sup>r</sup> or S<sup>r</sup> Thomas Lawrence no Secretary and that there was Letters writ to England to that Purpose this to the best of my Remembrance and further saith not p. 175

John LLewellin of S<sup>t</sup> Marys County aged Fourty Years or thereabouts upon his Oath taken on the holy Evangelist saith that M<sup>r</sup> Charles Carrol (did not long since) demand of the Deponent a Copy of the Proceedings upon the Tryal & Condemnation of his Beer to make sport with & laugh at in Company where he should come, or words to the same Effect so near as the Deponent can well Remember
