The Deposicōn of Joseph Edlowe sworne and Examined the 16<sup>th</sup> day of Aprill Anno D<sup>m</sup> 1650. Saith as followeth, viz:

That about a weeke before his death M<sup>r</sup> Robert Wiseman late of S<sup>t</sup> Maries in the Province of Maryland deceased Vppon this deponents request (pceiving him to bee a man not likely to live long) that hee would make some settlem<sup>t</sup> & disposicōn of his Estate or to that effect, desired him this depon<sup>t</sup> to take that Estate w<sup>ch</sup> hee the said Wiseman had into his possion and to manage it the best way hee could for the satisfaccōn of his the said Wisemans debts And if any Overplus remayned hee desired it should bee employed and disposed of to the best for the vse of his sonne John Wiseman or Words to that effect And hee this depon<sup>t</sup> further deposeth that hee doth not knowe that the said M<sup>r</sup> Wiseman made any further or other disposicōn of his Estate before his death then what is before rehearsed. And further this depon<sup>t</sup> saith, that by reason of some Ingagem<sup>t</sup> wherein this depon<sup>t</sup> stands bound for the said M<sup>r</sup> Wiseman and otherwise hee conceives himself to bee one of the greatest Credidors of the said M<sup>r</sup> Wiseman who was heretofore this depon<sup>ts</sup> Mate
