

Lib. R. Englishman shall kill any Indian that shall come unpainted & give such notice & deliver up his Armes as afors<sup>d</sup> he shall dye for it, as well as an Indian that kills an Englishman, and in case the Indians and English meete in the woods accidentally, Every Indian shall be bound immediately to throw downe his Armes upon Call and in case any Indian soe meeting any English man shall refuse to throw downe his Armes upon call he shall be Deemed as an Enemy.

4<sup>thly</sup> The Priviledge of hunting, Crabbing, fowleing, and ffishing shallbe p<sup>r</sup>served to the Indians Inviolable.

5<sup>thly</sup> If any Indian Stealeth an Hogg or Calf or other Beast or any other goods He shall und<sup>r</sup> goe the same punishm<sup>t</sup> that an English man doth for the same Offence.

6<sup>thly</sup> In case any Servants or Slaves runn away from their Masters or Children from their Parents, and come to any of the Indian Townes within the Territories of the Empero<sup>r</sup> of Assateague or the Kings before mentioned, they shall be bound to apprehend the s<sup>d</sup> ffugitives, and bring them to the next English Plantation, to be conveyed to their masters, and in case any Indian aforesaid shall convey or assist any such fugitives in their flight out of this Province he shall make the respective Ma<sup>t</sup> or M<sup>rs</sup> of such Serv<sup>t</sup> or Slave such Satisfaction as any Englishman ought to doe in like Case.

7<sup>thly</sup> The s<sup>d</sup> Empero<sup>r</sup> & Kings aforesaid shall not make any new peace nor shall not make any warr w<sup>th</sup>out the consent of the R<sup>tt</sup> Hon<sup>ble</sup> the Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> for the time being.

8<sup>thly</sup> In case the s<sup>d</sup> Empero<sup>r</sup> or Kings afores<sup>d</sup> or any Indian Subject to them belonging shall kill Ababco or any of his Indians, or any other in peace & Amity w<sup>th</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Lord Prop<sup>ty</sup> shall be esteemed as great an Offence as killing an English man

9<sup>thly</sup> That in case any Indian or Indians of any other nation or nations shall come w<sup>th</sup>in their Dominions or Territorys and shall by them or any other Indians und<sup>r</sup> them be entertained & th<sup>t</sup> any of th<sup>m</sup> the s<sup>d</sup> Indians shall kill any English, or kill or destroy any Hoggs, Cattle or Horses, or shall breake up any English mans house & steale his or their goods, th<sup>t</sup> he the said Empero<sup>r</sup> & the Kings afores<sup>d</sup> shall be responsible for the same, and in case hereafter they shall have knowledge of any other murderers th<sup>t</sup> killed David Williams & his ffamily th<sup>t</sup> they shall be hereby engaged to del. them up to the next Magistrate to be him conveyed to the Govrn<sup>r</sup> as soone as found.

10<sup>thly</sup> That the Empero<sup>r</sup> of Assateague & the Kings of Pokomoke, Yingoteague Muswattax, Amamessex, Acquaintica & Morumsco shall & will pay & del: at the plant<sup>a</sup> (upon w<sup>ch</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Stevens in Pokomoke now lives) called Rehoboth, to such pson as shall be appointed there to receive the same by
