Charles Calvert Cap^t Generall and Cheife Governo^r of the Province of Maryland und^r the Right hono^{ble} Cecil Lord Baltimore absolute Lord and Proprietary of the same To Cap^t Thomas Howell of the County of Baltamore in the said Province of Maryland gentl Greeting Whereas his most Excellent Ma^{ty} Charles the first (of blessed memory) King of England Scotland ffrance and Ireland defender of the faith & did by his Letters Patents under the greate Seale of England bearing date the 20th day of June in the Eighth yeare of his Majestyes Reigne and in the yeare of our Lord One Thowsand six hundred thirty Two graunt unto the said Lord Proprietary this Province of Maryland according to the bounds in the said Letters Patents mentioned and Expressed, wherein his said Ma^{ty} of blessed memory specefyeth the bounds of the said Province to Extend to the Seaborde side and Delaware bay to the fortieth degree of Northerly latitude, and for that the said Lord Proprietary hath lately Erected a County on the said Seaborde side at a place called the Horekeele and called it by the name of Worcester County which said County was inhabited by several psons who had taken the oath of fidellity
