Lib. R. To w^{ch} Letter was added a Postscript requireing Cap^t Brandt to examine Henry Hawkins touching some discourse he had had with Thomas Alcock (as his L^{spp} was informed) relateing to the murd^r of the Indian.

At a Councill held at Mattapony Sewall the nineth Day of June in the 5th yeare of the Dominion of the R^{tt} Hon^{ble} Charles &c^a Annoq Dmi. 1680:

Then conveened upon Receipt of a Letter from Capt Randolph Brandt of Charles County together with a note from John Munns of the same County relateing to the Pascattoway Indians and are as foll. viz.

Rtt Honble

Your L^{spps} Commands of the first instant have sent forward to Cap^t Aspinall, whom I und^rstand was on his Journey before the other ord^r was sent John Munns. Inclosed have sent your L^{spp} Munns pceedings relateing to the murd^r of the Indian which is all that cann be discovered at p^rsent; I shall vse my utmost endeavo^r to make what Inquiry I cann, and give acco^t thereof if any thing worth your L^{spps} notice, I have duely examined M^r Hawkins as to what Thomas Alcock told him, butt cannot discover any thing of the murd^r it lies betweene Aspinalls ffamily Alcocks, and the psons in the Virginia Boate.

I und'stand by James Smallwood your L^{spp} is not fully Satisfied with what I formerly wrote concerning the answer of the Pascattoways, they are very Desirous to remoove to Choptico if with yo^r L^{spps} leave, w^{ch} was there request at our last meeteing in the p^rsence of M^r William Chandler, w^{ch} I did signifye to your L^{spp}: and promised them your L^{spps} answer in four Daies, if I have made any mistake in that pticular I humbly begg your L^{spps} pardon; I suppose the greate men had been downe ere this, but I heare the Susquehannohs and Sinniquos have been fowle of them on ffriday last and have killed seaven of their men, This Information I have from one James Jefferson that came from the ffort and brought a horse from thence lately shott with an arrow. I have nothing else but the rep^rsentation of my due obedience Subscribe
