Gentlemen

Whereas I am informed by Lett<sup>rs</sup> which I have very lately  
recd: from Coll Tailor, Coll Digges, and Maj<sup>r</sup> Sewall, that  
Coll Geo: Talbott hath surrendred himself to the Govern<sup>t</sup> of  
Maryland in hopes to Receive his tryall there, And being  
also made sensible that it formerly was, and still is the Kings  
pleasure the said Talbott shall be brought over in the Quaker  
Ketch into England to receive his tryall here, and that in ord<sup>r</sup>  
thereunto his Maj<sup>tye</sup> has sent his Commands to the Govern<sup>r</sup> of  
Virginia to deliver him to Cap<sup>t</sup> Allin Command<sup>r</sup> of the said  
Ketch, who is to bring him over hither; I doe therefore hereby  
ord<sup>r</sup> and Require you upon sight hereof to deliver or cause to  
be delivered the said Talbott to the Govern<sup>or</sup> of Virginia to  
the end his Maj<sup>ties</sup> pleasure may be ffulfilled in this matter,  
whereof you are not to faile and soe I rest
