Produced at this Board Coppy of a blanck Warrant which was Given by Coll Darnall & M<sup>r</sup> Smith as a president to William Nuthead the Printer in order to print a certain Number of the same, for their Use, the Teno<sup>r</sup> whereof followed in these words, Viz<sup>t</sup>

Maryland ss: Lay out for  
Copy of Coll Darnalls blanck Warrant given the Printer to print & ca in any part of this Province not formerly laid out for any other person, nor Reserved for his Lordships Use, And Returne yo<sup>r</sup> Certificate of Survey thereof with the Name of the place in what County it lyeth, and of what Manno<sup>r</sup> to be holden into the Office by the day of next and for your soe doeing this shall be your Warrant Given vnder the Lesser Seale of our said Province this day of Annoq Domini one thousand six hundred Ninety

To Surveyor Generall or to his deputy These On the back of the aboves<sup>d</sup> Warrant was taken the following Deposition, Viz<sup>t</sup>

Printers Deposition of Coll Darnall & Mr Smith Octob<sup>r</sup> 14<sup>th</sup> 1693. The Deposition of William Nuthead of S<sup>t</sup> Maries City Printer Aged Thirty Nine years or thereabouts. This Depon<sup>t</sup> saith that Coll Darnall & M<sup>r</sup> Richard Smith comeing to this Depon<sup>ts</sup> house on the 6<sup>th</sup> of this instant month would have had him to have printed the within written blank Warrant to the Number of five hundred, to be done imediately out of hand, and that this Deponent did promiss to finish the same by Twelve of the Clock the next day if in case this Depon<sup>t</sup> had the assistance of a Joyner, which said Joyner did the Wooden Worke and was paid for the same in Money;
