It appearing to this Board that of the Money collected in Virtue of the Act of Assembly entitled "An Additional Supplement to the Acts for Assessment of Property" and now in the Hands of the Treasurer of the Western shore Fifty thousand Dollars can be spared from Defraying the necessary Expences of this State, It is therefore Ordered that the same be set apart towards complying with the first Quarterly Payment according to the late Requisition of Congress.
