And finding a Vacancy of an Officer of the Customs in the Rivers Bays Creeks and Harbours in Som'sett County & in the River of Nanticoke on the Eastern Shoare of the Province of Maryland by the death of John Dashield appointed by Deputation from the Comiss's of his Majtes Customs to be Surveyor of his Majtes Customs in the sd Rivers, Bays, Creeks, and Harbours. I doe hereby constitute and appoint you the said Robert Dacres to be Surveyor & Searcher of his Majtes Customs in Somersett County including also Nanticoke River & the Creeks thereunto belonging on the Eastern Shoare of the Province aforesaid with full power to enter into any Ship Bottom Boat or other vessell, as also into any Shop house Warehouse Hostry or other place whatsoever to make dilligent search into any Trunk Chest, pack, Case, Truss or any other parcell or package wisoever for any Goods, Wares or Merchandizes whatsoever prohibited to be imported or exported or whereof the Custome or dutyes, have not been duly paid, and the same to seize for his Majtes use, and also to putt in Execution all other lawfull powers & authorities for p. 167 the better manageing & collecting the said Dutyes in all things as the law directs, following & observing all such Rules and Instructions as you shall from time to time receive from the Comiss's of his Majtes Customs in England, or from the Comiss's of his Majtes Customs for the time being.
