Which Comittee being sent out at the prayer of the sayd Lynes.

Therefore the sayd Lynes came and in the house oblidged himselfe to be Concluded and abide by the Report of the said Comittee, and upon such report is never more to make any further claimes.

To all which the said Phillip Lynes did readily concurr with.
