I Thanke you on her Majestyes behalfe for your hearty Endeav^{rs} this present Sessions, and assure you I have not the least reason to be Dissatisfyed with yo^r proceedings, tho' I could haue wished this Sessions might haue continued soe long as to haue answered her Majestyes Royall instructions But for that the Trade and Shippeing requires you att your respectiue habitaōns, I shall be att p^rsent contented with the expectaōn of seeing you againe some few moneths hence, and now being advised by her Majestyes honble Councill th^t itt will be to the Satisfaction of the inhabitants to haue a new Election this p^rsent Grall Assembly, haueing continued for aboue three yeares, I doe Dissolve the same, and you are accordingly Dissolved
