Read a Letter from his Exc<sup>y</sup> the Earl of Bellamount dated at New York the 12<sup>th</sup> of November 1698 Which being Concerning the Indians there it is advised to be Communicated to his Excellency Col<sup>o</sup> Blakiston for his Majestys Service
