And further his Excell^{cy} & this Board do resolve & are
p. 932 inclinable some part of the s^d Revenue of 3^d p^h appropriated as a^d may be applyed towards the Building publick Storehouses for preserving the Arms and Ammunition in the Several Countys where necessary

But as to the Store House agreed to be built in this City his Excell^{cy} desires It should not be further proceeded on till the next Session of Assembly when some further Proposals will be made relating thereto

We are much concerned that your Honours do insist so much for inserting a Clause relating to the Attornys' fees in the Bill for relieving the Inhabitants of this province from some Aggrievances in prosecution of Suits at Law Since It passed your Board with some Amendments as your Honours may see by your Journal of the 30th of June wherein you never mentioned the said Clause
