I Desire you will Acquaint the House that I have Just now
Rec^d their Message by Col Maxwell and five more Desiring
my Acceptance of Two hundred pounds Currency for many
good Offices I have Done the Country

I am willing to Accept of that Sume as a reimbursement of
what I have really and Truly Expended (tho the Sum I have
given farr Exceeds this now Offerred) for Supporting &
Maintaining the Laws of this pvince from the Invasion of the
Papists and their Adherents on them, And this I give under p. 125
my hand Because I am now and at all times ready to maintain
the Truth of what I say that the Hon^r and Safety of Maryland
