Gentlemen

We are so Desirous of Omitting no Opportunity of Confering with your House in any Matter for the Good of the Province; That we could hardly perswade ourselves from Joyning with your House in the Conference proposed by your Message of the 15th Instant; until upon the best Consideration We had Satisfied ourselves by the Rule of Parliamentary Proceedings some Difference in Point of Judgment between the two Houses, Either on a Bill or some other Subject matter always preceds or gives Occasion for a Conference but to our Mutual Satisfaction, We hope there is not any such Difference at present, Therefore in Conformity to the Rules by which we ought to Govern ourselves, as well as to avoid the very Supposition of any difference (since there is not any such between the two Houses) We think ourselves Obliged to Wave at present the Conference proposed by your Message
