A Bill Entituled An Act for raising an Annual Revenue for the better support of his Lordships Governm^t and Governor, Read the first time and Ordered to lye on the Table.

The Report from the Committee of Aggrievances &c^a concerning Alienation fines on Devises being read and the Question put that the House concur therewith. Resolved in the affirmative
