6^{thly}

That all prisoners on both sides on acc^t of being concern'd in any Riots or Disturbances relating to the Bounds or for any Act or Thing done thereat or for any other Act touching the Right of either of the s^d provinces in relation to their Bounds be forthwith released & discharg'd on entring into their own respective Recognizance in a reasonable sum to appear & Submit to Tryal when call'd upon by further Order f^m his Majesty.

7^{thly}

That this be declar'd to be a Provisional & Temporary order to continue until the Boundaries shall be finally Settled & be declared to be without prejudice to either party.

8^{thly}

p. 33 That his Majesty may be most humbly moved to Discharge so much of the order of the 18th of Aug^t 1737 as varys for this Agreem^t & th^t the sev^l other petitions of complaint now depending before his Majesty in Council relating to any disturbances, may be withdrawn by the respective petitioners.

The Order of the King in Council at Kensington the 25th of May 1738, upon the Report made from the R^t Hon^{ble} the Lords of the Committee of Council for plantation affair dated the 4th of s^d month, relating to the foregoing Agreem^t of L^d Baltimore & Mess^{rs} Pens, mutually desiring their Lordships to revoke part of their Order of the 18th of Augst 1737.
