 the s^d Thomas Gerard to Luke Gardiner & Will^m Johnson, shall bee
 to him the s^d Luke Gardiner his heyres & assignes for euer.

An Informaōn of his L^{ps} Attorney agst ffrancis ffitzherbert ffor
 practising of Treason & Seditiō & gyuing out Rebellious & mutinous
 speeches in this his L^{ps} Prouince of Maryland, & indeuouring as far
 as in him lay to rayne distraction & disturbances in this L^{ps} s^d
 Prouince.

1. ffrancis ffitzherbert did on the 24th of August 1658 Trayterously
 & seditiously att a generall meeting in armes of the poeple of the
 Vpper parts of Patux^t Riuer to muster, endeauo^r to seduce, & draw
 from their Religion the Inhab^{ts} there mett together.

2. Hee did use the same Trayterous & Rebellious practice att New
 Towne on the 30th of August 1658. The poeple being mett together
 for the end afores^d

3. That by these his Treacherous & seditious practices, hath
 p. 103 caused seuerall Inhab^{ts} of this prouince to refuse to appeare att
 Musters, That they shall thereby bee incapable of Defending the
 peace & liberty of the Inhab^{ts} of his L^{ps} Prouince, agst the attempts
 of foreigne or home bred enimies.

4. That he hath Rebelliously & mutinously sayd th^t if Thomas
 Gerard Esq^r (of the Councell) did not come & bring his Wife &
 Children to his Church, he would come & force them to his Church,
 Contrary to a knowne Act of Assembly in this Prouince.

Since I writt my last to yo^u, I haue receiued a message from M^{rs}
 Gerard, w^{ch} is th^t M^r ffitzherbert hath threatned Excommunicaōn
 to M^r Gerard, because hee doth not bring to his Church, his Wife &
 Children, And further M^r ffitzherbert sayth th^t hee hath written home
 to the head of the Church in England, & th^t if it bee their Judgm^{ts}
 to haue it soe, hee will come wth a p^{ty} & compell them, My Lord this
 I offer to yo^r L^p as M^{rs} Gerards relaōn, whom I thinke would not
 offer to Report any such thing if it were not soe. And, my Lord, I
 thanke god the Gouvern^t of the Country is now in yo^r Officers hands :
 But I thinke (& I haue good grownds to thinke soe) that it will not
