John Butteris (p^r Attornat Walter Gwest.) brought into the Court
 his Account for worke, w^{ch} hee did for Cap^t Will^m Lewis in his life
 time amounting to Two thousand, six hund^d fifty six pounds of Tob.
 It is Ordered th^t the s^d Butteris proue his s^d Account in the next
 County Court in Charles County, (where hee is resident) or att the
 next Court after, & send the same downe in the Secretary's Office,
 who in the meane time will take notice of and: And th^t soe
 much of the s^d Lewis Estate be stoppt to Butteris, uppon profe
 made as was Butteris v.
Lewis's
Estate

Called afore the Board Henry Woolchurch and taxed for har-
 bouring Thomas Thurston contrary to an Order of the Councell
 published 23th of July last; & another Order likewise published the 3^d
 of August following. Attorney

The dēft denyeth th^t he did harbour the s^d Thurston, since the
 publishing of those Orders. Vid. fol. 280

And it not clearely appearing to the Court, th^t the dēft did enter-
 taine the s^d Thurston as afores^d. It is therefore Ordered th^t this time
 he bee acquitted. And th^t if att any time hereafter hee shall harbour
 or entertaine the s^d Thurston, hee bee fyned fwe hund^d pounds of
 Tob, to the L^d Prop^r both for this time, & fwe hund^d pounds of Tob
 more, for that time allso, hee shall soe harbour or entertayne him the
 s^d Thomas Thurston, as afores^d. Vide 3 Md.

Was called also afore the Board John Halliday, & Charged, for th^t
 being commanded by the Sheriffe to ayde & assist him, in apprehend-
 ing of Thomas Thurston, hee absolutely refused & denyed soe to doe.
 And it prouing a Contempt in the s^d Holliday by the Judgm^t of the
 whole Board. It is ordered That hee the s^d Holliday (hee hauing
 beene once afore whipt att Anarundel for the same fault) bee fyned
 fyue hund^d pounds of Tob. to the Lord Prop^r of this Prouince. Attorney

Was called afore the Board John Hall, & charged for not Execut-
 ing his Office of Cunstable, wherto hee was sworne: but in contempt
 of the Gouvern^t, released Thomas Thurston, then a Prisoner, & com-
 mitted to his Charge to secure. It is ordered, (by reason the s^d John
 Hall was a publike officer, & his Offence great, Though hee pleaded
 ignorance in the ffact) bee fyned One Thowsand pounds of Tob
 to the L^d Prop^r for his s^d contempt. Attorney

The Gouvern^r (att the instance of M^r Edward Lloyd interceding &
 knowing the Condiçōn of the man, who informed; th^t this fact was
 not done by him out of any Malice) doth remitt one halfe of the s^d
 fyne of One Thowsand pounds of Tob.
