Col^o Ludowick Weltner, Capt^s Michael Boyer, Charles Baltzel Christian Myers Lieut^s Martin Shugars, Jacob Grometh & David Morgan Ens. Jacob Raypold and Alex Smith Surgeons Mate, each one thousand one hundred and forty nine Pounds, fifteen shillings in lieu of the Articles of Stores allowed by the Gen^l Assembly from the 1st January 1780 to the 1st of October next.
