The House met according to Adjournment, the Proceedings of Yesterday were Read. The House having taken into Consideration his Grace the Duke of Newcastle's Letter

Resolved that a Sum not exceeding Pounds be applied for the Maintenance and Support of the Soldiers raised within this Province for his Majesty's Service and now in the Province of New York

Ordered that M<sup>r</sup> Phillip Hammond M<sup>r</sup> Key Doctor Carroll. Doctor Buchanan and M<sup>r</sup> Richard Gresham be appointed a Committee to make a Calculation of the Expence of maintaining Three hundred Soldiers for six Months and to find out Ways and Means to raise a Sum for that purpose and to make a Report thereof to the House

Doctor Charles Carroll delivers to M<sup>r</sup> Speaker a Narrative Complaint and humble Petition which was Read & Referred for Consideration to Morrow Morning.

A petition of M<sup>r</sup> Joseph Hall of Calvert County to this House was Read & Referred for Consideration to Morrow Morning.
