That the Issuing Commissary deliver to William Kilty sur<sup>n</sup> of the 5 Regiment four Gallons of Rum and sixteen pounds of sugar to the 1<sup>st</sup> of June and to Lieut John Kilty of the 3<sup>d</sup> Regim<sup>t</sup> L. Dragoons ten gallons of Rum and forty pounds of sugar to the 1<sup>st</sup> Sept<sup>r</sup> on Account
