That the said Treasurer pay to John Yeates one thousand pounds of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &<sup>ca</sup> of the money appropriated for the present Campaign to be delivered over to Hezekiah Reeder Commissary of Charles County on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to Lieut John Chever eight pounds two shillings and five pence of the same Emission, of the money aforesaid for Stores on Account

That the said Treasurer pay to Thomas Ijams four pounds eight shillings and six pence of the same Emission of the money approp<sup>d</sup> for the payment of Expresses &<sup>ca</sup> his allowance on the Journal of Acc<sup>ts</sup> May Session 1781

Col<sup>o</sup> Blaine called on the Board on his way to Virginia and informed us that a large Quantity of Spirits would be absolutely necessary for the Army in Virginia, and requested that as much might be purchased as could be procured; we accordingly wrote to the Commissaries of Montgomery, Frederick and Washington, to purchase what they Could in those Counties and sent 1500£ to the Commissary of Montgomery and 1000£ to each of the other Commissaries for that Purpose; since which we have heard from Montgomery that little or none could be procured in that County and Col<sup>o</sup> Price writes us on the 27<sup>th</sup> Ult<sup>o</sup> that "he doubted not, in the Course of the next week, to send off three or four Loads to George Town," where it was ordered.
