There are about 70 Recruits in this State, who only wait for Cloathing to be marched on to the Army. The Resolutions of Congress are so positive, that the United States shall pay, feed, and cloath the Army, that we are unwilling to furnish these Men with even necessary Articles, for they are almost naked, and we therefore have the Honor to request that Cloathing may be sent for them either
