That the western shore Treasurer pay to Capt John Mills, four hundred & thirty four pounds seventeen shillings & five pence—Allen Quynn Esq^r five hundred & forty three pounds, nine shillings & six pence—& Arthur Brian fifty seven pounds, twelve shillings & eleven pence of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &^{ca} due on Cert^s issued agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts &^{ca}—

That the said Treasurer pay to W^m Gordon seven pounds ten shillings of the same Emission due him per Acc^t passed.—

p. 233 Ordered that the western shore Treasurer pay to Judson Coolidge Esq^r two hundred and twenty four pounds, thirteen shillings and one penny specie agreeable to the Act to adjust the Debts due from this State per Certificates adjusted and passed the 4th Instant

That the said Treasurer pay to L^t Col^o John Thomas twenty one pounds, five shillings of the Bills emitted under the Act for the Emission of Bills of Credit &^{ca} due him per Account passed.—

That the said Treasurer pay to Maurice Simons Esq^r or his order forty thousand pounds of Tobacco on Account of Monies advanced to Officers of the Maryland Line, prisoners in Charles Town South Carolina the Amount of which cannot now be ascertained to be Accounted for
