Whereas by an Ord<sup>r</sup> of the Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court dated the 5<sup>th</sup> of Octo- [p. 322]  
Sep<sup>r</sup> 5<sup>th</sup>  
 ber 1659 It was Ordered that George Gooddrick should haue five  
 thowsand pounds of tobacco w<sup>th</sup>out abatement out of the Estate of  
 Cap<sup>t</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Lewes deceased Extended, as by the said Ord<sup>r</sup> more att  
 large appeareth, And whereas Edward Prescott did undertake to pay  
 the said five thowsand pounds of tobacco unto the said George Good-  
 rick as well as other debts to other Credito<sup>rs</sup> in Considera<sup>o</sup>n of a  
 Lease of the lands of the s<sup>d</sup> Lewes to him by the Lord Proprietary  
 Granted for and during the whole time of the Extent which Said  
 Su<sup>m</sup>e of 5000<sup>th</sup> tob: is yet unpaid as is auerred and the said Edward  
 Prescott doth willfully absent himselfe out of this Prouince to the  
 intent to defraud the Creditors of the said W<sup>m</sup> Lewes Estate
