

And the s<sup>d</sup> Francis Armestrong (alleging his wives weakenes & Liber B B  
her disability of traouelling soe far as to th<sup>e</sup> Prouinciall Court) prays  
that a Commis<sup>n</sup> be directed to some of th<sup>e</sup> Commis<sup>rs</sup> in Caluert  
County, before whom shee may acknowledge th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> fine.

Commis<sup>n</sup> thereuppon graunted to Cap<sup>t</sup> Thomas Manning, M<sup>r</sup>  
Will<sup>m</sup> Turner, & M<sup>r</sup> Thomas Letchworth (or any Two of them) to  
take th<sup>e</sup> acknowledgm<sup>t</sup> of a ffine from ffrances Armestronge to James  
fforbush & to Returne th<sup>e</sup> same next Prouinciall Court. Put in writt.

Will<sup>m</sup> Bretton Deposed sayth That Ensigne Rob<sup>t</sup> Cole late of this [p. 3]  
Prouince Deceased hath now ffive Children lyuing in this Prouince March 29<sup>o</sup>  
of Maryland, Begott of his louing & naturall wife Rebecca Cole also  
deceased, (Viz) Robert Cole his eldest sonne, Mary Cole, his eldest  
Daughter, Will<sup>m</sup> Maria Cole his second sonne, Edward Cole his third  
sonne, & Elizabeth Cole his youngest Daughter. All these are reputed  
& acknowledged th<sup>e</sup> Children of Ensigne Rob<sup>t</sup> Cole late Deceased as  
afores<sup>d</sup>. The s<sup>d</sup> Will<sup>m</sup> Bretton thereuppon having made oath & sub-  
scribed his hand this 29<sup>o</sup> March 1663.

This Indenture made the ninth day of August Año Dñi 1661,  
& in th<sup>e</sup> thirteenth yeare of th<sup>e</sup> Reigne of o<sup>r</sup> Souereigne Lord Charles  
th<sup>e</sup> Second, by th<sup>e</sup> Grace of god King of England Scotland ffrance  
& Ireland, Defender of th<sup>e</sup> ffayth &c: Betweene John Nutthall of  
Northhampton County in Virginia march<sup>t</sup> of th' one part, And  
Thomas Cornewalleys of Maryland in America Esq<sup>r</sup> & Penelope his  
wife of th' other part, All th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> p<sup>t</sup>ies now being in England.  
Whereas th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Cornewalleys & Penelope his wife By their  
Indenture of Bargaine and Sale Bearing date the day of th<sup>e</sup> date of  
these p<sup>r</sup>sents, And sealed & deliuered att one instant of time together  
w<sup>th</sup> these p<sup>r</sup>sents, Haue gyuen graunted bargeyned, sold aliened en-  
feoffed & confirmed unto the s<sup>d</sup> John Nutthall his heyres & Assignes  
for euer All that & those his Two Manno<sup>r</sup> & Mannors whereof the  
one is called Cornewalleys Crosse, & therein conteyned Two Thow-  
sand Acres of Land or thereabouts, And th' other of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Manno<sup>rs</sup>  
is knowne by th<sup>e</sup> name of S<sup>t</sup> Elizabeths, And therein likewise is con-  
teyned Two Thowsand Acres of Land or thereabouts, Both of them  
being scytuate lying & being in Maryland in America afores<sup>d</sup>, & now  
are in th<sup>e</sup> tenure or occupaōn of th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup> Thomas Cornewalleys &  
Penelope his wife their undertenents or Assignes, With all & singu-  
lar Rights members & appurteñces whatsoeu<sup>r</sup> of or to the sayd man-  
no<sup>rs</sup> both or eyther of them belonging or in anywise apperteyning
