[p. 449] That Robert Peyton by his Obliga<sup>o</sup>n bearinge date the first day of June One thowsand six hundred sixty ffowre Is and standeth bound unto the said Thomas Browne in the su<sup>m</sup>e of Eleauen poundes ffourteene shillings of lawfull money of Englande which said su<sup>m</sup>e is yet unpaid and the Attorney of the s<sup>d</sup> Robert Peyton being Barnaby Jackson refuseth to pay the same unless Ordered by this Honno<sup>ble</sup> Court

Wherefore yo<sup>r</sup> pet<sup>r</sup> humbly prayes Order ags<sup>t</sup> the said Barnaby Jackson the Attorney of the said Robert Peyton for the aforesaid su<sup>m</sup>e of Eleauen pounds ffourteene shillings And he shall pray &<sup>c</sup>.

Cecilius &<sup>c</sup> To the Sherriffe of S<sup>t</sup> Marys County Greeting Whereas an Order of Our Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court held the 6<sup>th</sup> day of Aprill 1664 past ags<sup>t</sup> William Hollingworth att the suite of Tho<sup>m</sup>. Wynne uppon which Iudgm<sup>t</sup> att Our Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court held the 23<sup>d</sup> day of Decemb<sup>r</sup> 1664 the said William Hollingworth assigned Errors which did to us then manifestly appeare, Whereuppon att our said Court was Ordered that supersedeas issue from stopping Execu<sup>o</sup>n uppon the said Iudgm<sup>t</sup>, We Co<sup>m</sup>and yo<sup>w</sup> that yo<sup>w</sup> make knowne unto the said Thomas Wynne that he be at Our next Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court to be houlden at S<sup>t</sup> Marys on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of February next to shew Cause if any he haue why the said Iudgm<sup>t</sup> should not be reuerst w<sup>th</sup> a rehearing of the meritts of the whole Cause att Our next Prouin<sup>all</sup> Court as aforesaid and haue yo<sup>w</sup> there the names of those persons by whome yo<sup>w</sup> haue made this knowne unto him, Giuen att S<sup>t</sup> Marys this 31<sup>th</sup> day of January 1664 Wittnes Our deare Brother Philip Caluert Esq<sup>z</sup> Our Chancello<sup>r</sup> & deputy Leiu<sup>t</sup>enn<sup>t</sup> of Our said Prouince of Maryland
