 what means we the Jurors aforesaid are altogether Ignorant And  
 further we the Said Jurors Say that John Douglas Jun.<sup>r</sup> the Son  
 of the af.<sup>d</sup> John Douglas deceased is the Sole Surviveing Legatee  
 of the S.<sup>d</sup> Bridgett Heard according to the best information we can  
 gett, therefore we the Said Jurors do find that the Said John Douglas  
 is the true and Lawfull heir to the Said one thousand acres of Land  
 no other Legattee appearing to us to be Liveing and that the Said  
 John Douglas is fifteen years of age, And We the Jurors afores.<sup>d</sup>  
 (fol. 298) further Say that we find not William Heard afores.<sup>d</sup> possessed within  
 his life any more Lands, In Testimony whereof as well the Com-

#### James Lindsey Inquisition of Land Called Green Spring

An Inquisition taken before us Henry Adams and Ignatius  
 Causeen of Charles County in the Province of Maryland Gent at  
 the house of m.<sup>r</sup> William Chandler at the head of Portobacco Creek  
 this Twenty Sixth day of June Anno Domini 1679 By virtue of a  
 Commission in the nature of a writt of mandamus to us directed  
 bearing date the fifteenth day of march Anno 1678 and to this
