

The Cou^{rt} doth therefore Order, th^t th^e s^d Jn^o Salter shall accord- Liber A
 ing to an Order from th^e Prouinciall Cou^{rt}, dated Octob^r 18th 1654
 and thearein Exprest, th^t whoesoeuer should bee found to dispossesse
 Izack Iliue of th^e quiet Enioyment of his planta^{con}, should pay th^e
 Charges of th^e suite Occasioned by th^e sd dispossessor which now th^e
 Cou^{rt} hath found to bee John Salter; And thearefore doth Order
 th^t th^e sd Jn^o Salter shall pay unto m^r Iliue uppon all demaunds,
 seauen hundred fourtie seauen pounds of to^b in Caske, which is th^e
 wholl Charges of th^e suit now, at this Cou^{rt} & formerly at th^e
 Prouinciall Cou^{rt} Expended

m^r Henery Morgan, in behalfe of m^{rs} Broadnox, & by her Request,
 hath desired a Refference, to th^e next Cou^{rt}, in an Action of Slander,
 whearin Jn^o Salter is plaintiffe; The Cou^{rt} doth thearefore graunt
 th^e same

Whereas Mathew Reade, Jn^o Salter, W^m Price, Henery Telior,
 Henery Clay & Marie Crutch, (for misbehauio^r, in deboist drink-
 inge, p^{ph}aning th^e Sabbath & sume of th^m shutting of, or discharg-
 inge gunes, unseasonable; all which hath beene made suffissiently
 appeare) beinge sumond to this Cou^{rt} & hath deserud puⁿishment,
 upon their promis of Amendment, & beeing their first Offence,
 after Admonission, their Offence is Remitted, payinge Court
 Charges els Execution

The depposition off m^r Tho: South aged 30 years or thereabouts
 taken in Court th^e 25th of April 1655 Sworne Examined & Saith

That about th^e midle of July last past, Franchis Broockes of
 Marieland Came to th^e place, wheare yo^r deponent liued, & tould him
 that hee had giuen Jn^o Salter possession of Beuernecke, and upon
 that possession giuen, yo^r deponent Came there to liue, as as Co-
 partner in the plantation, with the said Salter and further saith not

Bee it known unto all men by these p^rsents That whearas my [fol. 100]
 husband Henery Carline in indebted to m^r Henery Morgan a Certaine
 summe of tob I Rachell Carline doe by vertue heareof for securinge
 of the sd tobacc^o to m^r Henery Morgane bynd ouer foure head of
 Cattell vid^t on cow, on twoe yeare ould heiffor on femall yearlinge &
 one steere of twoe yeare ould all marked with a flouredeluce in the
 left eare and Cropt on the Right eare, I doe allsoe bind ouer all ou^r
 stocke of hoggs marked as afforesayd & all the sayd goods soe to
 rest and remaine for securitie to the sd m^r Henery Morgan his heires
 Executo^{rs} Administrato^{rs} and Asignes till such tyme as the sayd
 tobacc^o bee satisfied and payd & for Confirmation heareof I haue
 heare unto put my hand this [blank] of June 1655
