 this Prouince wherein I am either p^lt: or defend^t and whatsoeuer
 my said Attorney shall lawfully doe in my behalfe in either prose-
 cuting imprisonning Releasing Compounding or Agreeing I doe
 binde my selfe my heires Executo^{rs} and Administrato^{rs} to Confirme
 & allow to all intents and purposes w^tsoeuer as done by my selfe
 in person, as wittnes my hand this 25th march 1666

 Sowth James Ringgould and John Ringgould, being wittnesses sum-

Wether yo^w doe not know that about 6 or 7 yeares since M^r
 Thomas Ringgould of the County of Kent had a warrant for 1200
 acres to take up, and that the suruey^r Generall did depute the said
 M^r Ringgould to marke out his land himselfe

Thomas South answers affirmatiuely as allsoe James and John
 Ringgould Affirmatiuely

[p. 256] Wether yo^w were not wth M^r Ringgould when he went to ueiw a
 peece of land on the Easterne Shore neer adjoyning unto the land

Wether yo^w did not heare M^r Tho: Ringgould make an agreem^t
 wth m^r Thomas Hynson, That hee should haue halfe of his warrant
 aforesaid Restoring him soe many rights againe, and that he was
 to suruey it altogether and Pattent it all in M^r Tho: Ringgolds
 owne name, and after wards to Assigne the halfe thereof unto m^r
 Tho: Hinson hee paying M^r Ringgould halfe of the Charge
