The above men<sup>c</sup>oned Conveyance of two hundred acres of land &  
 with the endorse<sup>m</sup>t thereon was acknowledged in open Court by  
 Robert Cossleton & Mary his wife unto John Cassock the first day of  
 this Court before the Com<sup>r</sup>s then Sittinge.

John Hill acknowledgeth the ensueinge Tract of Land conteyninge  
 One hundred & fiftie acres unto Philip Lynes in open Court Vizt.

This Indenture made this ninth day of January In the yeare of  
 our Lord One thousand six hundred Seaventy & three Betweene John  
 Hill of Charles County in the Province of Maryland Planter of the  
 one parte & Philip Lynes of the County aforesaid Inhoulder of the  
 other parte Witnesseth that the said John Hill for & in considera<sup>c</sup>on  
 of two thousand six hundred pounds of tobacco & one Dunn horse to  
 him in hand at or before the sealeinge & deli<sup>v</sup>y of theis p<sup>r</sup>ntes by  
 the s<sup>d</sup> Philip Lynes well & truly paide the receipt whereof th<sup>e</sup> s<sup>d</sup>  
 John Hill doth hereby acknowledge, & himselfe therewith fully  
 satisfied & paide and thereof & of every parte & p<sup>r</sup>cell thereof doth  
 clearely acquitt exonerate & discharge the said Lynes his heires  
 execut<sup>r</sup>s & adm<sup>r</sup>s by theis p<sup>r</sup>ntes, Hath given granted bargained  
 & Solde enfeoffed & confirmed & by theis p<sup>r</sup>ntes doth give grante  
 alien bargain sell enfeoff & confirme unto Philip Lynes his heires &  
 as<sup>s</sup> forever a certaine p<sup>r</sup>cell of Land (called Wheelers Palme) lye-  
 inge on the North side of Piscatoway River neare to th<sup>e</sup> lande  
 formerly layde out to Robert Hueson of the Province Planter, begin-  
 inge at a marked Oake by the River side boundinge on th<sup>e</sup> South
