 porting there is due to the Province of Maryland, by his Brother  
 William Hunts Books £381..18..10, which was remitted by S C. to  
 M.<sup>r</sup> Hunt in two Bills of Exchange, by Order of the Lower House  
 of Assembly, 30.<sup>th</sup> June 1730, to M.<sup>rs</sup> Frances Ungle Administratrix  
 of Robert Ungle Esq.<sup>r</sup>, late Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, the  
 said Sum appeared by M.<sup>r</sup> Ungles Books to be due from him as  
 Treasurer of the Eastern Shore, for Duties on Negroes and Irish  
 Servants, in his hands, the Bills remitted to M.<sup>r</sup> Hunt were my own  
 on M.<sup>r</sup> Hanbury for £150. and another on M.<sup>r</sup> Samuel Hyde for  
 £231..18..10., M.<sup>r</sup> Hunts Receipt for both was Communicated to  
 the Lower House and I suppose entered on their Journal.
