Gentlemen of the Upper and Lower Houses of Assembly.

I have thought fit with the Advice of the Lord Proprietary's Council of State to Prorogue this Assembly to the First Monday in April next, you are therefore to take Notice that you are Prorogued to that day accordingly.

Thus ends this Session of Assembly begun and held at the City of Annapolis on Tuesday the sixteenth Day of November, ending the Twenty third day of December following in the Third year of the Dominion of the Right Honourable Henry Harford Esq<sup>r</sup> Anno Domini 1773.
