

Robert Martin of Somerset County Sworn and Examined on the part of the Compl<sup>t</sup> Saith as follows Viz<sup>t</sup>

That in the year 1719 he this Dep<sup>t</sup> was Sherr of Somerset County and that then the Complainant Obtained Execution by Elegit from the Prov<sup>t</sup> Court for about Thirteen Thousand Pounds of Tob<sup>o</sup> ag<sup>t</sup> the Def<sup>t</sup> Brewerton and Directed to the Deponent and that when he went to Execut the S<sup>d</sup> Writt he went to the Def<sup>t</sup> Brewertons house and Desired his Wife to Shew him the S<sup>d</sup> Brewertons Goods but Could get None the S<sup>d</sup> Dep<sup>t</sup> further Saith that he Afterw<sup>ds</sup> went to Lay out the Land mentioned in the return of the Said Writt whereto the S<sup>d</sup> Dep<sup>t</sup> prays Leave to referr for Certainty as a part of Brewertons Lands for the use of the Complainant to Satisfie the S<sup>d</sup> Execution and the Def<sup>t</sup> Came and Shewed the Dep<sup>t</sup> a Deed for that Land and ordered him not to proceed any further upon it but that the Said Depon<sup>t</sup> did proceed to Execute the S<sup>d</sup> Writt thereon and Summoned the Said Adams at req<sup>t</sup> of the Comp<sup>l</sup> as Garnishee and further Saith not.

Depositions of Wittnesses taken at the house of Thomas Gillis in Somerset County upon the 29<sup>th</sup> day of June 1724.

Will<sup>m</sup> Hayman of Somerset County Aged about 50 years Sworn and Examined on the part of the Def<sup>ts</sup> Saith as follows Viz<sup>t</sup>.

1 That he hath heard the Compl<sup>t</sup> Say that he hath Lent the Defend<sup>t</sup> Brewerton Tob<sup>o</sup> and Would either tak his Land or Tob<sup>o</sup> again but that he hath often heard the Deft Brewerton Say that the Comp<sup>l</sup> had Lent him Tob<sup>o</sup> till he knew he Could not pay him and then would have his Land upon his own Terms

2 That the Def<sup>t</sup> Brewerton hath Severall times told the Deponant after August Court 1719 that he had Conveyed to the Def<sup>t</sup> Adams Sixty Acres of Land w<sup>ch</sup> was to be Valued by Capt<sup>n</sup> John Jones and Jn<sup>o</sup> Roache and Whatever Value they put upon it the S<sup>d</sup> Adams was to pay the Said Brewerton for it The Depon<sup>t</sup> further Saith that when the Said Brewerton was Arrested by virtue of a writt Sued out by the Compl<sup>t</sup> ret to August Court 1719 he Applied himself to the Def<sup>t</sup> Adams to be bound for his Appearance etc. but the S<sup>d</sup> Adams refused and Brewerton was much enraged at it and further Saith not.

That while he was C<sup>l</sup>k of Somerset County Court he very Seldom mentioned upon the back of Deeds given him to Enrole the Time of his receiving them or indeed any thing more then the Day and year he entered them upon the Record and the place where and further Saith not.
