A Survey had e taken of a parcel of Land for Robert Ingram  
Lying e being on the North side of Witaromara Creek Called  
Kellams folly Beginning at a marked tree standing at the  
mouth of the aforesaid Witaromara Creek thence running  
east South east along the Creek side the breadth of one hundred  
e eighty pole to a marked oak standing by the side of a small  
gull dividing it from the Land of Richard Sterne from thence  
running North North east the length of four hundred thirty four  
pole and from thence running west North west the breadth of one  
hundred e eighty pole to a marked pine And with a line drawn South  
South east to the first boundary Cont: e Land out for five hundred  
e fifty Acres more or less the size of some 565 ; /

Rights made good for 300 Acres by the s<sup>d</sup> Ingram in 1664  
after w<sup>ch</sup>: rights assigned to his widow by Permeall Rowd 1668,  
Incommodum Ingram being deceased intestate leaving a wife e three Children  
The eldest Sonne John Ingram desired Patent in his name  
This Co<sup>rt</sup> taking the premises into their serious Consideration  
Do find by Confession of Tho: Ball that he by s<sup>d</sup> Tho: Ball was  
to give upon Ingrams Land this therefore ordered that s<sup>d</sup>  
Tho: Ball between this e the first day of May now next being  
plant one hundred Apple trees upon Ingrams Land at usual  
Distance e Peape sufficient standing aboute four ; /
