Senate bill entitled "An Act to add five sub-sections to Article 10, of the Code of Public Local Laws of the State of Maryland, title 'Dorchester County,' sub-title 'Wild Fowl,' to be known as 'Sections 335, 336, 337, 338 and 339.'"
