AMENDMENTS PROPOSED.

Amendment 1. In line No. 9, of section 1, after the word "money," strike out the words "or assets."

Amendment 2. Strike out the whole of section 2.

Both of which amendments were severally read and adopted.

The bill, as amended, was then read a second time.

Senate bill entitled "An Act to authorize the Board of Police Commissioners of Baltimore city, to pension Andrea P. Caldwell, formerly a policeman and clerk of the police force of Baltimore city."

Which was read a second time.

Also, unfavorably,

House bill entitled "An Act to repeal sections 740 and 741, of Article 4, of Public Local Laws, entitled 'City of Baltimore,' sub-title 'Police Commissioners,' as amended and re-enacted by chapter 123, of the Acts of 1898, and to re-enact the same with amendments."

Mr. Johnson moved to substitute the bill for the unfavorable report.

Which motion was lost by a yea and nay vote, and the unfavorable report was adopted.
