The following Acts of the General Assembly of Maryland, originating in the House of Delegates, were presented to the Governor for his approval this day, at 11.15 o'clock.

Chapter 15. An Act to repeal section 740 and 741, of Article 4, Public Local Laws, entitled "City of Baltimore," sub-title "Police Commissioners," as amended and re-enacted by chapter 123, of the Acts of 1898, and to re-enact the same with amendments.

Chap. 16. An Act to provide for the creation of a Board of Police Examiners for Baltimore city, to define
