Relief from
surety bond.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That James H. Dodd, one of the sureties upon the bonds of William J. Blunt, late collector of State Taxes for the years 1886 and 1887, his legal representatives, his heirs, devisees and legatees, shall be relieved from any and all liability to the State for and on account of his suretyship for said Blunt on any and all the official bonds given by him as Collector of State Taxes, and all suits against him at law or in equity shall be entered dismissed and satisfied.

SEC. 2. *And be it further enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.

CHAPTER 260.

AN ACT to authorize and empower the Trustees of the Poor of Worcester County to sell and convey certain real estate in said county, called Rochester and Purnells Outlet, and upon which is now located the County Alms House.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland,* That the Trustees of the Poor of Worcester County be and they are hereby authorized and empowered to sell and dispose of a certain tract of land in said county, known and called by the name of Rochester and Purnells Outlet, and upon which is at present located the County Alms House, and be a good and sufficient deed or deeds to grant and convey the same to the purchaser or purchasers thereof.

SEC. 2. *And be it enacted,* That this Act shall take effect from the date of its passage.
