

1 to lean away from any secret proceedings to more open
2 proceedings.

3 I believe in one instance at least we provide,
4 that for instance, votes by which we confirm officers
5 should be by open vote. This is now conducted in executive
6 session. This will be another step toward making all
7 proceedings public. I certainly think this Constitutional
8 Convention will set a good example by requiring as much
9 of the proceedings of the legislative bodies to be
10 open. You will recall at the beginning of this session
11 there was high indignation when there was the suggestion
12 we have a secret ballot in the organization, that there
13 was a provision provided we could have secret committee
14 meetings at the discretion of the committee. I think we
15 are on sound grounds to require public scrutiny.

19 that we should face the problem on reconsideration
20 rather than going through it and facing it later on the
21 vote on the item itself.
