8 sentence of Amendment No. 11, wherein we say "Any suspen-  
9 sion shall be for the period of the emergency only, to  
10 make sure that the suspension is extremely tightly construed  
11 in a time fashion and only provisions of this Constitution  
12 concerning continuity of State and local public offices  
13 and concerning inferentially their governmental operations  
14 may be suspended, so that we try to indicate that we  
15 do not want to get into any other spheres of the Constitu-  
16 tion, and particularly not Bill of Rights spheres, so we  
17 cannot suspend personal rights and privileges.
