

1 THE PRESIDENT: Delegate Caldwell.

2 DELEGATE CALDWELL: In the last four months  
3 that I have been here I noticed many of our delegate  
4 have gained weight. Now that the Convention is over,  
5 I think they should all take up jogging -- except the Balti-  
6 more City delegates.

7 In ten minutes of jogging, they can travel  
8 through five single member districts. (Applause.)
