2 for the Senate in 1797. It was in continuous use as the
3 desk of the President of the Senate. The chair has been
4 constantly in the State House ever since its manufacture.
5 It is truly an historical piece of furniture.

6 I have a message received just yesterday from
7 the Pennsylvania Constitutional Convention. I will ask the

10 tional Convention of 1967-68 to the Honorable H. Vernon
