

1 clear. If we take out the term "or make any contribution"
2 the sentence would still be in effect that the judge could
3 not hold any office in any political party or an organiza-
4 tion.

5 In our view there are, as I understand it, Demo-
6 cratic and Republican sustaining funds and it would seem to
7 me that if a judge would want to willingly contribute to a
8 party of his choice he should be entitled to do so.

9 THE CHAIRMAN: Delegate Marvin Smith.

10 DELEGATE M. SMITH: The point has been made back
11 here that it would be absolutely against the canons of
12 judicial ethics for a judge to make such a contribution.

13 THE CHAIRMAN: Any further discussion? Are you
14 ready for the question?

15 The Clerk will sound the quorum bell.

16 The question arises on the adoption of Amendment
17 No. 47. A vote Aye is a vote in favor of the amendment;
18 a vote No is a vote against.
