

1 And some of those youngsters at Frostburg
2 explained to me why they did this. They explained to me
3 that they did not feel that they were old enough to
4 assume some of the other responsibilities which were in
5 concomitance with the right to vote.

6 They did not believe that they really ought to
7 be able to buy their own cars, to contract their own
8 debts, to accept the responsibilities of willing those
9 assets which they had.

10 The boys among them did not believe that they
11 really ought to be able to marry without their parents'
12 consent, and when I found that out on the basis of really
13 a two to one vote among the people who are represented
14 in this group by a delegate who was the president of the
15 senior class the preceding year and who is a member of
16 this committee which reports to you today, I could only
17 reach the conclusion that perhaps they were smarter than
18 I was in some respects, that they knew wherein lay their
19 responsibilities, that they knew that which they felt they
20 were entitled to tackle themselves.
