

1 There being fifty-two votes in the affirmative
2 and seventy-two votes in the negative, the motion is
3 lost and the Amendment to the Amendment is rejected.

4 The Chair recognizes Delegate Cardin. Do
5 you desire to submit your Amendment?

6 DELEGATE CARDIN: Mr. Chairman, my inexperience
7 and ineptitude in this type body places me in a quandary.
8 I would like to introduce my Amendment, but I would not
9 like to introduce it now. I should like to explain, if
10 I may. Perhaps you can assist me.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: State your inquiry.

12 DELEGATE CARDIN: There are members here who
13 have stated that if twenty-one were to fail, they would
14 prefer to vote for twenty. If we vote on this Amendment
15 of twenty now as I understand your arrangements in the
16 voting order, we will preclude the opportunity of voting
17 afterwards. Is that correct?

18 THE CHAIRMAN: You would, but you would lose
19 that opportunity anyhow if you did not offer the Amendment
20 now, and if Amendment No. 1 were adopted. If Amendment
21 No. 1 fails, you would then have the opportunity to submit
