3 to offer the amendment as we consider R&P-1 section  
4 for section. If you would have the page get Dr. Benson,  
5 he will prepare your amendment for you.

6 DELEGATE KIEFER: I rise to a point of inquiry,  
7 sir. Do I understand you to say that that phraseology is  
8 not in the present recommended preamble?

9 THE CHAIRMAN: It is or it is not?

10 DELEGATE KIEFER: It is.

11 THE CHAIRMAN: I didn't understand, then.

12 You are referring to the phrase on lines 15 and  
13 15, that all political power originates in the people?

14 DELEGATE L. TAYLOR: Yes.

15 My question was, could I amend the first section  
16 of the Declaration of Rights. I wasn't relating this to the  
17 preamble. I was relating it to the first section of the  
18 Bill of Rights.

19 THE CHAIRMAN: Would you wish to remove that  
20 clause from the preamble?

21 DELEGATE L. TAYLOR: Not necessarily so.
