 his said Maister Randall Revell the xxviiith day of August last past & returned againe
 againe to his said Maister the xxviiith day of September following whereupon it ordered
 that the said Dennis Cdees pay service to his said Maister Randall Revell or his assigns
 according to the Act of Assembly

 of September last William Elgati sent to y^e Clerk his List of Disables of y^e Inhabitant
 of Wicoromore hundred beinge taxable persons in y^e hundred one hundred & seveny & seven
 After the Clerk & under Sheriff had examined the whole list from the Constables delivered
 found they did amount to thirtene hundred & twelue taxable persons The said Roger
 Burbum the same day sent the whole list by William Richardson to Capt^m W^m Whittington
 High Sheriff of this County
